Domestic Violence Information

Schools out and summer is here. For some people this may mean a vacation to the beach, hanging out at the river or enjoying the natural resources we have here in our state. But for some, summer also brings an increase in the incidences of domestic violence. A six (6) year study of intimate partner violence (IPV) data showed a greater percentage of all crime occurs at night, on the weekends, **and during the summer**.

Monthly reports of IPV increase during the summer months, with July being the month with the highest number of reported IPV incidents.

The first day of each month and the weekends consistently included more incidents of IPV than any other day of the month or days of the week.

There is a strong relationship between particular holidays and incidence reports of IPV.

New Year's Eve, New Year's Day, Memorial Day, and **Independence Day** are dates with total domestic violence reports higher than the normal daily average.

WHILE THE HOLIDAYS MAY BRING AGGRAVATING FACTORS TO THE EQUATION SUCH AS FINANCIAL STRESS AND ALCOHOL CONSUMPTION, BATTERING IS ALWAYS INTENTIONAL AND IS NEVER THE FAULT OF THE VICTIM!
