Leadership Seminar Re-cap

Due to Covid restrictions and with everyone's safety in mind, the OFWC Leadership Conference was held, virtually, on March 13th, via *Zoom*.

OFWC Leadership Chair *Pam Briggs*, First Vice-President *Wendy Wheeler-Jacobs* and President *Karen La Voie* worked hard to put together a seminar that was interesting and informative.

Twenty-six attendees took part in the two hour workshop, including our guest speaker, Shannon Bailey, the GFWC National Leadership Chair. There were two panel discussions that addressed very timely topics. Each panel was composed of three members from different clubs.

The topic tackled by the first panel was "*How Has the Pandemic Impacted Clubs*?" They addressed questions dealing with meetings, fundraising, activities, membership, making accommodations in those areas and the lessons learned from these new experiences. The second discussion was focused around *Building & Engaging New Leaders*.

These panelists had been members of OFWC for varying amounts of time. The tips learned from each discussion are posted in this newsletter. A number of short videos were shown throughout the morning, each with a different message, all pertaining to leadership.

Two videos about the Hugh O'Brian Leadership Program were played. The first one was a general overview of the program, which has long been one of the GFWC Affiliate Programs. HOBY is in 19 countries worldwide and in all fifty states. HOBY has been in Oregon since 1984 and takes place at Willamette University in Salem. The second HOBY video was filmed at an Oregon conference a few years ago. It was great to hear our First Vice-President, Wendy Wheeler-Jacobs, talking about her experience involving HOBY, both as a student and then, as a mentor.

One of the highlights of the seminar, was having the GFWC Leadership Chair, *Shannon Bailey* be a part of our program. She was so personable and engaging and spent time showing us how to use GFWC's Member Portal, which can be a huge stumbling block for many. Her talk about the GFWC Leadership Toolkit helped bring it to life and made it much less intimidating to use. We so appreciated her taking the time to spend the whole seminar with us.

We received very good feedback from our attendees and we are already looking forward to next year's Leadership program and finding ways to develop future leaders for the Oregon Federation of Women's Clubs.

Building and Engaging New Leaders Tips captured from our leadership seminar panelists

- Be willing to volunteer, don't be afraid to raise your hand or step up \diamond Assess your strengths and weaknesses and seek out opportunities that are a good fit \diamond Be involved in your club and what is going on, make decisions that help your club \Diamond Ask others to step up to a role, or delegate other opportunities for them to grow \Diamond Attend OFWC or GFWC meetings/events to understand the big picture \diamond Utilize the tools and resources available, like those in the Leadership Toolkit \Diamond Learn by doing; see every new opportunity as a learning experience \diamond Even if you don't succeed the first time, keep trying \Diamond No one wants to see you fail; Lean on your GFWC family to learn and grow together \Diamond Prepare in advance, and practice to help overcome fears like public speaking \Diamond Practice 'Unity in Diversity' by accepting differing opinions \Diamond
- Remember that as a leader your responsibility is to bring out the best in others
- ◊ Be kind!
- Take time to make decisions knowing that they impact others
- Ask for help when necessary and don't take everything on yourself
- Practice self-awareness to recognize that it's not all about you but the position/role
- ♦ Apply for **LEADS**
- Seek out a mentor...either from GFWC or outside the organization for a different perspective
- Plan ahead. Failure to plan is a plan to fail.
- Identify what is most important and do that first
- Evaluate and determine the level of involvement you want to have and make that a goal

Saidie Orr Dunbar Nursing Education Fund

The *Saidie Orr Dunbar Nursing Education Fund* was established in 1956 to recognize her contribution to public health in Oregon. She is considered the "Founder of Public Health Nursing in Oregon." She was the only Oregon clubwoman to serve as GFWC President, being elected in 1938.



Over the years the Fund has been administered by the American Lung Association and the Oregon Federation of Women's Clubs. Recently the American Lung Association indicated they no longer wished to be a Trustee of the Fund.

We are in the process of completing the paperwork to make OFWC the sole Trustee. This change in the Trustees for the Fund will require a number of bylaws changes which will be addressed at the OFWC May meeting.

The Scholarship is awarded to a person studying nursing, particularly in the area of public health.



April 24th is Federation Day!

Did you know that *April 24th is the official Federation Day* for the General Federation of Women's Clubs?

What are you doing to celebrate? Last year some of us gathered together (with masks) at the **Mt Scott Cemetery** in Portland to place roses on the grave of *Saidie Orr Dunbar*, a past OFWC President and the only Oregon member to serve as a GFWC International President.

Epsilon Sigma Omicron


Epsilon Sigma Omicron (ESO) is an honorary educational society open to all dues paying GFWC federated club members.

Over 60 years ago, the ESO program became a permanent part of the GFWC Education Department. Through ESO, clubwomen are given direction in planned reading for self-enrichment and personal growth.

ESO provides clubwomen with a structured reading program that is educational and stimulates a desire for self-improvement. Members can participate in ESO as part of a reading group or on their own. The program provides membership, awards and certificates, pins, reading lists, and a framework in which to pursue continued self-improvement through reading.
