Fine Arts Scholarship Fund

The Fine Arts Scholarships are comprised of Penny Art, Violet Lang Music Vocal, Violet Lang Music Instrumental and Essay. Scholarships are awarded to eligible graduating Oregon High School Seniors. Each applicant must be an Oregon resident.

A contest is held each year and scholarships are awarded as follows:

\$500 Vocal
\$500 Instrumental
\$400 Art
\$400 Essay (Theme alternates each year between Unity and Diversity and Growth In Service.)

Each year it costs at least \$1,800 to hold the contest. The fund must keep \$15,000 in an investment account according to the GFWC OFWC Bylaws. The fund is able to use accrued interest along with donations from clubs and fund raising to support the scholarship program. Due to the stock market crash and low interest rates, the fund is not self-sustaining. It is in dire need of money if the competitions are to continue.

WE NEED YOUR HELP!

Clubs are encouraged to contribute to the Fine Arts Fund. If each club is able to donate \$106 we will have enough to keep the contest going this year. There will be a challenge presented at the Fall Sate Board meeting. Clubs will receive a purple pencil case to be used as their FUNDS FOR FINE ARTS collection container. It can be passed around at each club meeting or event. The money collected should then be sent to Elsie Dustin the Fine Arts Scholarship Fund Treasurer. Clubs may also consider having a special fundraiser to help raise the \$106. Possibilities include Charity Buncos, selling table runners, selling cards/crafts. The list is endless!

Prizes will be awarded to clubs who are able to raise \$106 or more and to clubs who come up with the most creative way to raise the funds.
